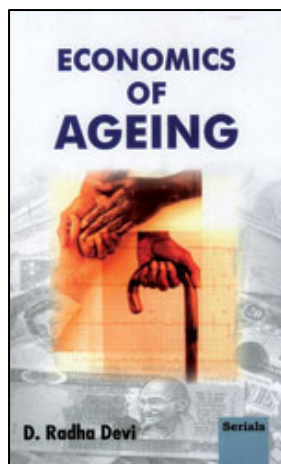

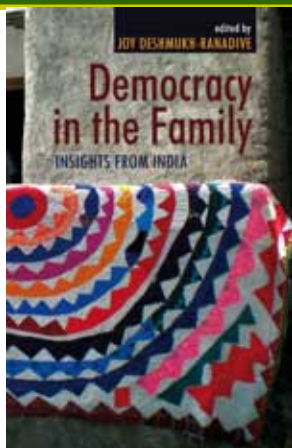


Economics of Ageing, by **D. Radha Devi**, Publisher: Serials Publications, Pages: 190, Edition: 2008, Price: Rs.595.00, \$ 28.00 Publishers & Distributors: serialspublications@vsnl.net, serials@satyam.net.in

This book examines how the possession of assets or the lack of it affects the health of the elderly and their involvement in household decision making and household activities. As many studies are not undertaken in this area, it is hoped that this book will lead to some discussions on the subject and further studies of similar nature would be carried out, to reveal the role which money plays in the lives of the elderly in the course of their ageing with dignity and in getting a feeling of belonging to the households of which they are a part of.

Economics of ageing essentially relates to the financial requirement for the care of the aged or the available finance to take care of the elderly or how the economic status of the elderly is likely to affect the different aspects of their life in the household. In poor societies where the majority is engaged in the informal sector including agricultural and related activities, many older persons will not have any financial support or care except from their own underprivileged families. Such a situation can create a great deal of mental strain for both the elderly and the care giver as the latter will have to stretch the available resources to cover the needs of the elderly, besides their own needs and that of their children

The interface between principles of democracy inside and outside the home is explored through the sub-themes of `Experiencing the Family`, `Expressing the Family`, `Seeking Justice` and `Including the Excluded`. The topics covered range from examinations of the institution of the family, the site of the household, practices of house holding and relationships between members, the impact of non-democratic norms and attempts to seek justice in the face of domestic strife and violence, to the advocacy of inclusive strategies that involve men and entire communities in democratizing the family

On the Global AIDS Epidemic

The 2008 Report on the global AIDS epidemic confirms that the world is, at last, making some real progress in its response to AIDS. Governments are acting on their commitments made at the 2006 United Nations High Level Meeting on HIV/AIDS, to scale up towards universal access to HIV prevention, treatment, care, and support by 2010. As of 2008, a small number of countries have already been providing universal access to antiretroviral treatment and to services to prevent mother-to-child transmission of HIV. Twenty-seven years into the epidemic, AIDS continues to challenge all of our efforts. Today, for every two people who start taking antiretroviral drugs, another five become newly infected. 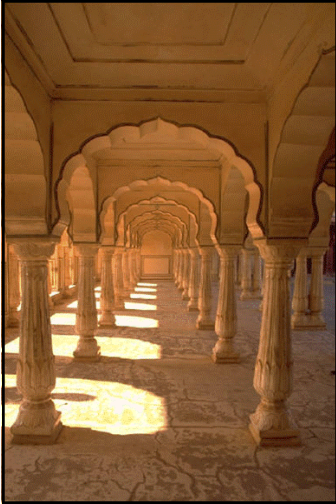

The main objective of the study is to assess awareness among various social groups regarding the participation of children with special needs in the community. To achieve the objectives a survey was conducted among various groups such as teachers of both schools and colleges, doctors, final year undergraduate and postgraduate students of Physiotherapy, Pharmacy and Nursing profession and general population in and around the PSG Hospitals and PSG rural health centre, Coimbatore. About 190 students participated in the study. Data were collected through a questionnaire consisting questions related to community awareness and attitudes towards participation issue. About half of the students surveyed have stated that community members are not aware of the activities that exist for the children with special needs.

3. **Knowledge, stigma, Perception about HIV/AIDS and Acceptance of HIV/AIDS testing among Pregnant Women, R. Baranitharan, V. Mahalakshmi, V. Kokila,** PSG College of Physiotherapy, Peelamedu , Coimbatore -641 004 baranipt@yahoo.com

This study evaluates the knowledge, perception and stigma about HIV/AIDS, and their acceptance of HIV/AIDS testing among pregnant women. Data were collected through a pre designed questionnaire consisting of questions regarding knowledge, perception and stigma about HIV/AIDS and acceptance of HIV/AIDS testing and was administered to 134 pregnant women who visited the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, PSG Hospital, Coimbatore. Results revealed that the level of awareness of HIV/AIDS among pregnant women was about 81.7 percent. The sources of information were TV, radio, posters, followed by news paper .

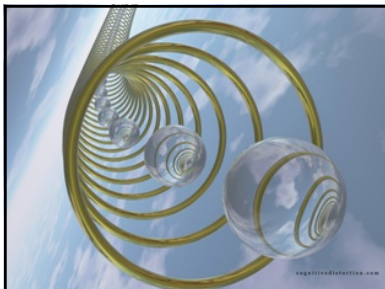
