The specific issues raised during the conference are:

Health inequality exists according to social and economic environment and hence the public health programme should consider these inequalities and formulate the interventions accordingly.

The social representations of various stakeholders such as health administrators, financial institutions, health professionals, and grassroots level workers should be explored of the target community for whom the health delivery system has to be developed.

Alleviation of rural poverty is possible through rural development programs and development of house hold industries and improving the agricultural activities. Health insurance policy and financial assistance to the poor should be incorporated in the health program

To reduce maternal mortality, regional government and the international community must create programs of health care and increase the number of medical and nursing students (Medical manpower).

The availability of female health worker is critical for improving use of maternal health services.

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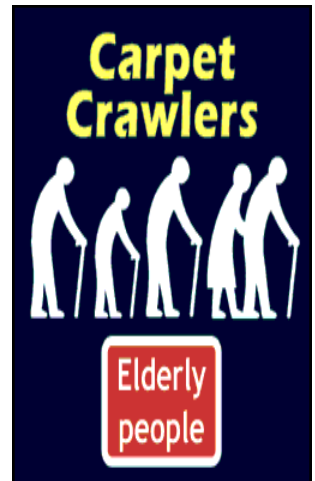

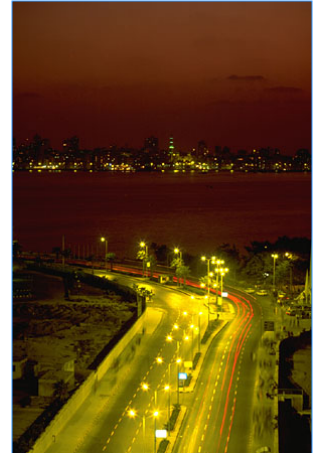
III. FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMS

WORLD HEALTH REPORT 2008

The report, titled **Primary Health Care Now More than Ever**, launched in October, 2008 commemorates the 30th anniversary of the Alma-Ata International Conference on Primary Health Care held in 1978. The report critically assesses the way that health care is organized, financed, and delivered in rich and poor countries around the world. The WHO report documents a number of failures and shortcomings that have left the health status of different populations, both within and between countries, dangerously out of balance. The conclusion of the report is that health systems will not naturally gravitate towards greater fairness and efficiency. Deliberate policy decisions are needed.
