



MEMORIAL LECTURES — 2018

Indian Association for Social Sciences and Health (IASSH)

Third Professor John Caldwell Memorial Lecture



Professor John Charles (Jack) Caldwell died on 12th March 2016 at the age of 87 in Canberra. Caldwell's seminal work included documentation of the role of mother's education in fertility limitation and child mortality decline and the role of circumcision in inhibiting the spread of HIV/AIDS in Africa. He is known for his "wealth flows" theory, which relates demographic transition theory to changes in intergenerational transfers within the family. A 2009 survey of nearly 1000 demographers worldwide, named Jack Caldwell the most influential researcher of all time in the field of demography. In 1985, the Population Association of America (PAA)

presented him with its highest prize, the Irene B. Taeuber Award for excellence in demographic research. In 1994, he began an elected four-year term as President of the International Union for the Scientific Study of Population (IUSSP), and, in 2004, he was presented with the prestigious United Nations Population Award. These are the three highest international honours in the field of demography and no other person has won all three of these awards. He has encouraged and mentored many young scholars from India, and good number of them received their Ph.Ds from Department of Demography of Australian National University (ANU) under his able guidance. His anthropological demographic work on south India, particularly on marriage and fertility, received lot of research attention.

Upon request from his students, colleagues and friends, the Indian Association for Social Sciences and Health (IASSH) instituted a memorial lecture in his honour. The First Prof. John Caldwell Memorial Lecture was held in 2016 at Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics, Pune. The Second Memorial Lecture was held in 2017 at National Institute for Rural Development (NIRD), Hyderabad. Well known Demographer **Professor Christophe Z Guilmoto** will deliver the Third Prof. John Caldwell Memorial Lecture on the theme-"Cesarean deliveries in India: too many yet too few". The lecture will be held at JNU Convention Center, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi on 10th December 2018 at 6

pm, on the occasion of the 16th Annual Conference of IASSH jointly organized with CSRD, Jawaharlal Nehru University. Dr. Guilmoto is a senior fellow in Demography at the French Institut de recherche pour le développement (IRD) based at CEPED in Paris and teaches at Université Paris Descartes. He received Ph.D. in Demography at Paris University in 1989. His recent research has mostly focused on sex selection from East Asia to Southeast Europe. He is the author of the UN report on sex imbalances at birth (UNFPA 2012) and has recently co-edited the book-Demographic Transformation in China, India and Indonesia- with Gavin Jones (Springer 2016). His work since 2017 has been published



in Population Studies, Population and Development Review and the Lancet Global Health.

Fifth Dr. K.E. Vaidyanathan Memorial Lecture



Dr. K.E. Vaidyanathan, a distinguished demographer and former President of IASSH, passed away on 4 th June, 2014. He was a faculty at the International Institute for Population Sciences, Mumbai during 1968-1971. In 1971, he joined the Institute of Rural Health and Family Planning, Gandhigram, as Head of the Department of Population Studies and also served as its acting Director for a short period. Later, he joined the UN system as a Demographer in Cairo Demographic Centre, which is the regional centre for Africa and the Middle-East. In 1976 he moved to Syria as an UN Adviser to help establish the Centre for

Population Studies and Research and to advice the Planning Commission of Syria. This was followed by a posting in Kampala, Uganda to serve as a faculty in the Institute of Statistics and Applied Economics in Makarere University, Kampala. In 1979 he became the UNESCO Regional Adviser for Population Education in the Arab region, and in 1982 he moved to ILO as the Regional Expert for Household Surveys under the National Household Survey Capability Programme (NHSCP) in the Arab region. He later served during 1992-96 as the Chief Technical Adviser for the Sudan Population Census of 1993, which was acclaimed as the most successful census ever held in that vast and complex country. In 2001 he helped plan and implement the Living Standards Measurement Survey (LSMS) in Bosnia- Herzegovina. He was the President of the Indian Association for Social Sciences and Health (IASSH) from 2007 to 2011 and was mainly responsible for the growth and expansion of the Association to its present form.

Considering his significant contributions, IASSH instituted a memorial lecture in honour of Dr. K.E. Vaidyanathan in 2014. The Fifth Prof K E Vaidyanathan Memorial Lecture will be delivered by distinguished social scientist **Professor Sonalde Desai** on the theme: "Food Security or Nutrition Security? Challenges for National Food Security Act". Dr. Sonalde Desai is a Professor of Sociology at University of Maryland, USA, with joint appointment as a Senior Fellow at the National Council of Applied Economic Research (NCAER), New Delhi. She received Ph.D. from Stanford

University and post-doctoral training at University of Chicago and The RAND Corporation. Her work deals primarily with human development in developing countries with a particular focus on gender and class inequalities. She has published articles in a wide range of sociological and demographic journals. Presently Dr. Desai is leading a large nationally representative panel survey of over 40,000 households - India Human Development Survey (IHDS), and also directs the National Data Innovation Centre (NDIC). The lecture will be held on 11th December 2018 at 6 pm at JNU Convention Center,

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
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
