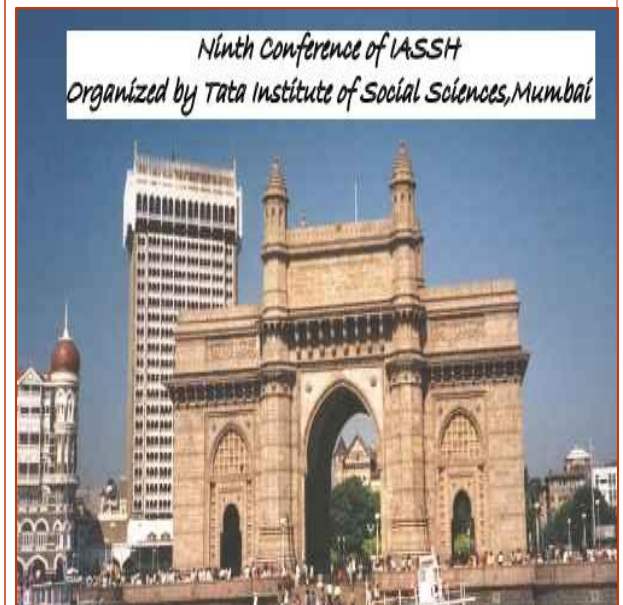
## NINTH CONFERENCE OF INDIAN ASSOCIATION FOR SOCIAL SCIENCES AND HEALTH (IASSSH)

## Knowledge Resources

### **Population Census of India, 2011**

The provisional results of the 2011 Population Census of India have been released. Provisional data from the census was released on March 31, 2011. Complete results are expected to be released in 2012. This was the 15<sup>th</sup> population census of India and the seventh population census taken after independence. Some salient features of the census are given here. House-listing phase began on [April 1, 2010](#) and involved collection of information about all buildings. Information for National Population Register was also collected in the first phase, which will be used to issue a 12-digit unique identification number to all Indians by [Unique Identification Authority of India](#). The second population enumeration phase was conducted during the period 9 to 28 February 2011. Census has been conducted in India since 1872 and 2011 marks the first time biometric information was collected. According to the provisional reports released on March 31, 2011, the Indian population increased to 1.21 billion with a decadal growth of 17.64%. India added 181 million to its population since 2001. India with 2.4% of the world's surface area accounts for 17.5 % of its population. [Uttar Pradesh](#) is the most populous state with roughly 200 million people. A little more than 6 out of every 10 Indians live in [Uttar Pradesh](#), [Maharashtra](#), [Bihar](#), [West Bengal](#), [Madhya Pradesh](#) and [Tamil Nadu](#).

The growth rate of population in rural and urban areas was 12.18% and 31.80% respectively. Bihar (23.90%) exhibited the highest decadal growth rate in rural population. Literacy rate (for population 7+) increased to 74.04% with a decadal growth of 9.21%., 82.14% of males and 65.46% of females being literate. Information on [castes](#) was included in the census following demands from several ruling coalition partners. Information on caste was last collected during [British Raj](#) in 1931. UNICEF has dedicated its flagship Publication *State of the World's Children 2011* to adolescents. Today's youth faces an increasingly uncertain world where climate change, rapid urbanization, the economic recession and rising unemployment pose unprecedented challenges. There are 1.2 billion adolescents across the world; nine out of ten of these young people live in developing countries. Millions are denied their basic rights to quality education, health care, protection and exposed to abuse and exploitation. Recognizing the need to turn this vulnerable age into an age of opportunity, the report highlights the importance of investing in adolescents for breaking the cycles of poverty and inequity.

- **UNFPA Report on “State of the World’s Population, 2010”**

The New **UNFPA Report** links Peace, Security and Development to Women’s Rights and Empowerment. When women have access to the same rights and opportunities as men, they are more resilient to conflict and disaster and can lead reconstruction and renewal efforts in their societies, according to *The State of World Population 2010*, published by UNFPA, the United Nations Population Fund. The report’s release coincided with the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the United Nations Security Council’s landmark [resolution 1325](#), which aimed to put a stop to **sexual violence against women and girls in armed conflict and to encourage greater participation by women in peace-building initiatives**.

“When women and girls suffer deep discrimination, they are more vulnerable to the worst effects of disaster or war, including the weapon and humiliation of rape, and less likely to contribute to peace-building, which threatens long-term recovery,” said UNFPA’s Executive Director [Thoraya Ahmed Obaid](#) at the launch of the report. “If we’re serious about preventing conflicts, recovering from war and natural disaster and building lasting peace, we need to empower women, as well as the young and the elderly, to become agents of positive change,” Ms. Obaid added. The report shows how communities and civil society are healing old wounds and moving forward. However, more still needs to be done to ensure that women have access to services and have a voice in peace deals or reconstruction plans.

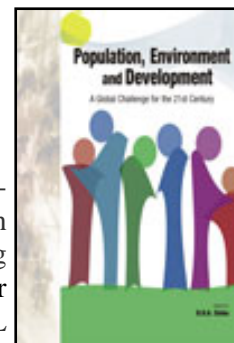

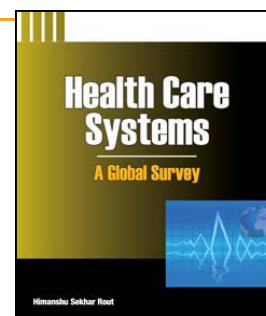

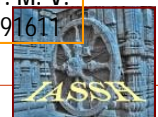
