



Ranking of Districts in Bihar and Jharkhand for Area-specific Planning : (Manual)

Author/s: PFI

PFI has developed a socio-demographic index based on social development and reproductive health indicators and ranked the districts in the two states accordingly. The report will be of particular interest to policy makers, health programme managers and all those engaged in advocating improved health and social development in the two states.

Youth in India: situation and needs study (International Institute for Population Sciences)

The Institute in collaboration with the Population Council, New Delhi had successfully completed a pioneering research to document young people's transition to adulthood in six states of India, namely Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Rajasthan, Jharkhand and Bihar. The specific objectives of the study are:

- 1. To identify key transition facing youth, including education and livelihood opportunities and experiences
- 2. To provide evidence at state level on the magnitude and patterns of sexual and reproductive practices in and outside marriage, and related knowledge, decision-making and attitude among youth.
- 3. To identify the key factors underlying their sexual and reproductive health, knowledge, attitudes and life choices.
- 4. To disseminate findings in a variety of forums and to a range of stake-holders and make recommendations for programming for youth.
- 5. To provide opportunities to and build capacity of researchers interested in pursuing research on issues pertaining to youth

Both qualitative and quantitative approaches were used covering behaviors and experiences of young people on a number of issues; ranging from schooling, marriage and sexual behavior. Gender role attitudes and relations with parents were also be studied. The establishment of an independent State Nutrition Mission - the Rajmata Jijau Mother - Child Health & Nutrition (RJMCHN) Mission - in collaboration with the Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Maharashtra and UNICEF in 2005-2010 was an initiative of Government of Maharashtra to improve the nutritional status of children and women in the state. Thereafter, the state launched Mission Phase-II (2011-2015) with a focus on the 1,000 day *Window of Opportunity*- from conception to age two years - covering the most vulnerable children: the youngest, the poorest and the excluded.

The Comprehensive Nutrition Survey in Maharashtra, 2012 is the first ever state-specific nutrition survey with a focus on infants and children under two years and their mothers. A representative sample of children under two years of age was selected from each of the six administrative divisions of Maharashtra namely, Amravati, Aurangabad, Konkan, Nagpur, Nashik and Pune. Data collection took place during February-May, 2012. The fact sheet presents preliminary information on the nutrition situation of children under two and their mothers, child feeding practices and selected indicators of mother's empowerment and education.
