# **Background**

India's vision of Viksit Bharat (Developed India) by 2047 emphasises inclusive growth and human well-being as the foundation of national progress. Therefore, to achieve the goal of *Wellness for All*, it is vital to integrate social science perspectives into health policy and practice.

Medical interventions alone cannot address the complex health challenges of today. Social science research provides a nuanced understanding of community behaviors, health-seeking practices, and the social determinants of health. Integrating these perspectives into health policies ensures that interventions are culturally relevant, context-specific, and socially just. A comprehensive approach that synergises the advances in medical sciences with social science insights can enhance health system responsiveness, foster community participation, and promote wellness for all and also ensures inclusivity, equity and sustainability.

This conference intends to generate a dialogue that connects evidence-based research with policy priorities, thereby contributing to India's broader development goals. It seeks to provide an interdisciplinary platform for scholars, policymakers, practitioners, and civil society to deliberate on how social sciences can strengthen health systems and ensure equity in the journey towards a Viksit Bharat.

## Call for Papers

The Indian Association for Social Sciences and Health (IASSH) invites original and unpublished research contributions for presentation at the National Conference. Authors are requested to carefully follow the guidelines below while preparing and submitting their work. Submissions should include an Extended Abstract or Full Paper on topics relevant to the conference themes. Each submission must also include a separate Abstract not exceeding 300 words. The Extended Abstract/Full Paper should clearly present the background, rationale, objectives, data and methods used, analysis, key findings, and discussion of results. Please include the name(s) of the author(s), their designation, institutional affiliation, and email address. An author may submit a maximum of two papers, either individually or jointly with co-authors. All submissions will undergo peer review by the Expert Committee. The decision on acceptance will be communicated to the authors through the IASSH website and email. The Abstract and Extended Abstract/Full Paper must be submitted online at <a href="http://www.iassh.org/onlineabstract.aspx">http://www.iassh.org/onlineabstract.aspx</a> on or before 6th December 2025.

# **Youth Best Paper and Poster Awards**

There will be a competition for **best paper awards** and **best poster awards** for younger scholars in the conference. Based on the paper and its presentation, an Expert Committee will select best research papers and best posters from young scholars (less than 30 years of age). The best youth paper should be single authored research paper. Interested young scholars are encouraged to submit their **Full-Paper** online for the competition by mentioning "**For Young Scholars Research Paper Award**".
